Looking Ahead:

NYS DOS LULA grant coming to closure. Purchase Development Rights for watershed properties will be again presented in April training. Mr. Laffin presented the threat of the Star Wart, an invasive species plant now affecting parts of Keuka Lake. Chairman Butchko suggested that KWIC might want to look at a program at Lamoka-Waneta Lakes that takes on these invasive plants. He noted that the organization is meeting this Saturday and that he would obtain a copy of the organizations structure, by laws, etc. and share this with the KWIC board for consideration.

In addition due to the severe drought 'conditions in 2016 KWIC needs to consider who might be in a position say when water restrictions may come in play.

Jim Smith of Yates County Legislation is attempting to re-establish the Seneca Lake SLAP 5 program, similar to Keuka's KWIC program. Chairman Butchko offered assistance and help to Mr. Smith in his endeavors.
